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# CREATING A COMPETITIVE ENVIRONMENT IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF PRIVATE MEDICAL SERVICES IN NAMANGAN PROVINCE.

After gaining independence, Uzbekistan began to reform the health care system. Improvement of market relations, modernization of the economy, the transition to technical and technological renewal also set new requirements for the health sector due to the radical development of the private medical sector.

For this purpose, in accordance with the Resolution of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan dated 01.04.2017 PQ-2863 "On measures to further develop the private sector in the field of health care", great attention was paid to the development of private medicine.

In particular, the number of medical specialties that can be practiced by private medical institutions has been increased from 50 to about 150. As a result, joint clinics of foreign clinics are being established in Uzbekistan. It is also planned to transfer such medical services as hemodialysis, laboratory analysis, sterilization to the private sector by private medical institutions on the basis of public-private partnership. They are also:

Until January 1, 2022, it will be exempt from all taxes and customs duties. Taxes have been abolished in order to create favorable conditions for specialists from reputable foreign clinics. Due to such high attention and privileges paid to the non-governmental medical system in our country, their number has increased by 450 in one year, reaching almost 4,000.

In 2018, it is planned to develop a concept for the introduction of a system of gradual accreditation of all medical institutions, based on best international practices. For example, on the basis of Saydana private medical institution in Namangan region, a training center for the development of private medicine and training of qualified personnel has been established in the country.

Another important aspect is that in Namangan region, according to the plan for 2021, the number of projects is 44, of which 37 are planned to establish new private medical institutions and 7 - to expand the medical activities of existing private medical institutions.

During 2020, 39 new private medical institutions were established, 9 of which were expanded on the basis of modern technologies. In Table 1 below, you can see this at the level of districts under the jurisdiction of Namangan region.

As a result of the new organization and expansion of activities, 407 jobs were created, including 113 doctors and 178 nurses, and 450 additional beds were created. By the end of the year, 10 new private institutions and 7 existing hospitals will be expanded. planned. This situation has allowed the private medical sector to create a competitive environment in market relations. It is gratifying that entrepreneurs operating in the private sector, taking advantage of the above benefits, today began to use the latest technology. Another important aspect is the competitive environment between them and the development of customer service.

Today, in Namangan region, such prestigious clinics as "Saidana", "Guangzhou", "Anamed", "Doctor-A", "Aydin shifo" announce various campaigns to attract clients.

As an example, the private clinic "Saydana", along with the announcement of promotions over the months, the diagnostic center "Saydana" is equipped only with the latest, high-precision equipment, which allows you to make a very accurate diagnosis in the shortest possible time.

The brand of MRI machine at the diagnostic center "Saydana" is MAGNETOM ESSENZA 1,5T - a new generation of "magnetic resonance imaging", which raises the speed and accuracy of MRI scans to a new level. All types of inspections are fast, accurate and have high quality imaging.

Creating a competitive environment in a market economy is one of the key steps in "where there is no competition, there is no growth" so the development of the private sector can be said to be the best way to improve their health.

Taking into account the fact that the number of private medical institutions in Namangan region is growing year by year, increasing competition between them, the most important of which is improving prices, quality and services, the decisions and decrees issued by the President show how correct. Therefore, it is important for us that the increase in living standards leads to the creation of a pure competitive environment for the development of the services sector. Table 2 below shows the order of growth of the number of private medical institutions and the number of beds (beds) in Namangan region from 2017 to 2020.

Together with the Ministry of Health, based on the regional morbidity rates and needs of the population, more inpatient private medical institutions specializing in narrow areas are being established. Most importantly, in 2017, the legal framework of the industry was strengthened due to more than thirty decisions and decrees of the President.

In 2017, a total of 7.1 trillion soums will be allocated from the state budget for the development of the health sector. In 2018, 9.6 trillion soums will be allocated from the state budget for this purpose. As part of the Investment Program for 2017, 552.6 billion soums will be allocated for medical facilities with 181 7350 beds and 9430 visits in the system of the Ministry of Health. soums were directed. Today, construction, reconstruction and overhaul of these facilities are being completed.

As part of the Investment Program for 2018, 803.6 billion soums will be allocated for the construction, reconstruction, overhaul and equipping of 290 medical facilities with 5863 beds and 20,418 flights in the system of the Ministry of Health. soums are planned to be allocated.

At the end of the 2020 summary, a question naturally arose: only if the representatives of the industry, especially the leading cadres, can respond to the

initiatives initiated by the head of state with practical action. Only then will the medical system be able to develop and move forward.

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
